2 Mar 2016 — Thank you to everyone who has already signed, commented and shared. Your comments in particular have provided a great insight into the community view, and we have received some very positive feedback from decision makers.

LTGEN Evans has completed his report and it is with the New Assistant Minister for Defence Michael McCormack. LTGEN Evans' report has not been made public.

A decision on this matter could be made in weeks, or take months. Michael McCormack is the third Assistant Minister for Defence since this proposal was announced.

Julie Bishop and Colin Barnett have both shown an interest in this from the outset, and Seaward Village and Allen Park are within their electorates. We know that Michael McCormack has already met with them on this issue. We also know that any decision will have to go to Cabinet (where Julie Bishop is an important member).

The City of Nedlands has taken a strong position in relation to the local issues and needs our support.
